
Many classes have completed ASDAN work and S1

Personal Development

- Practice fire safety protocols—ensure smoke detectors are operational and teach children how to respond in an emergency.
- Create safe travel plans—be prepared for more extreme weather and busier roads, pack emergency travel kits and ensure children are wearing seatbelts.
- Be aware of allergies—communicate allergy information when out in cafes and restaurants.
- Prevent the spread of illness— emphasise good hygiene including hand washing with children.
